## In the News... Rotary Service to Humanity

in 1989-90, Maya Ajmera was the recipient of a Rotary International Graduate Fellowship to study in South Asia. While in India waiting for a train, she saw a group of children being taught by a teacher on a train platform. She learned that what she was seeing was a Train Platform School for impoverished children who could not attend school.

Moved by what she saw, Ajmera applied for and won a seed grant to help build an organization to support innovative grassroots efforts on behalf of vulnerable children around the world. Thus began the Global Fund for Children in 1993. Since its founding, GFC has awarded more than \$32 million in grants to over 600 organizations in 80 countries, improving the lives of millions of children.

In recognition of her work, Ajmera was chosen by The Rotary Foundation Trustees to receive the 2013-14 Global Alumni Service to Humanity Award. She will receive the honor at the Rotary International Convention in Sydney on June 3.
