Rotary Breaks World Record in Sydney, Australia

During Rotary's international conference last month, 340 participants climbed the Sydney Harbor bridge and raised enough money to protect 240,000 children from polio. The group broke the world record for most flags flown, with 278.

The massive turnout eclipsed Oprah Winfrey's world-record climb in 2011 when



she summited the bridge with 315 of her most ardent fans. But for Rotary members, the record paled in comparison to the experience and the opportunity to take a step closer to ending polio forever. The event raised \$102,300 to end polio.
