Last Week: District Governor Tim Kaminski

Rotary International’s theme this year is “Light Up Rotary.” District Governor Tim Kaminski challenged Rotary members to fulfill that theme by “telling your Rotary story.” In doing so himself, he said, he has never had to invite anyone to join Rotary. Instead, people become inspired and want to be part of it, because of “the power of Rotary.”

Tim has been a Rotary member for more than 15 years and has served in many leadership roles in his own club. At one point, he was trying to find a way for his local club to participate in international activities. He got involved in Rotary’s exchange program, which brings in young leaders from other nations to learn accountable governance. He later helped to charter a new program for U.S.-Russia exchange. He noted that Rotary International is the only NGO to have a seat in the United Nations. These and many more are examples of the power of Rotary to light up the world.

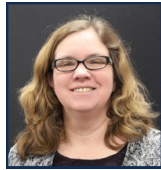

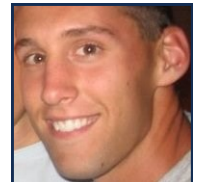
- Pancake Karnival is scheduled for October 5. Tickets were distributed at last week's meeting and by mail. Please return money from ticket sales to Irene Schafer.

Welcome New Rotarians



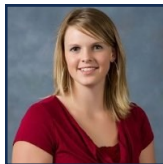
