- Rotary International has 1.2 million members.
- An endowment “for the purpose of doing good in the world” was first proposed at the Rotary convention in 1917. (Rotary was founded in 1905.)
- The first gift from the Rotary Foundation, for \$500, was made to the International Society for Crippled Children – the precursor to Easter Seals.
- In 1947, on the death of Rotary’s founder, Paul Harris, a memorial fund in his name received significant contributions, expanding the Rotary Foundation.
- Rotary Foundation grants fund humanitarian projects around the world that advance Rotary’s priorities:



- ⇒ Promoting peace
- ⇒ Fighting disease
- ⇒ Providing clean water
- ⇒ Saving mothers and children
- ⇒ Supporting education
- ⇒ Growing local economies



- The world is 99% polio-free thanks to Rotary and its global partners.
