

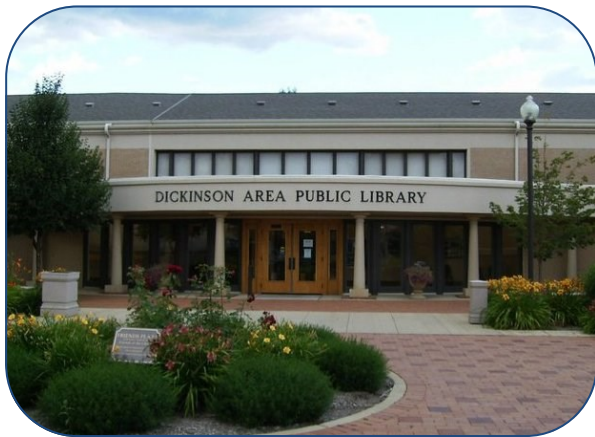

Last Week: Dickinson Area Public Library

The Dickinson Area Public Library is truly a source for all kinds of information. Rita Ennen, library director, noted that literacy support is just one of the services the library provides. In addition to books in print and electronic format, the library offers language learning resources, as well as a number of programs on a daily, weekly, and monthly basis for citizens of the area. Ennen also shared usage statistics for the library. In 2014 the library saw 129,552 visitors, had a circulation of 114,087, and had 40,378 computer users throughout the year. Program attendance was outstanding with 12,458 people participating in their programs.



The library is currently in the midst of two of the bigger programs that they offer. The Winter Reading Program has 336 participants this year, and their tax prep advisory program will run up to tax day on April 15.
