The newest project, under construction this year, is a life skills center. This facility will act as a student union for employees over the summer. 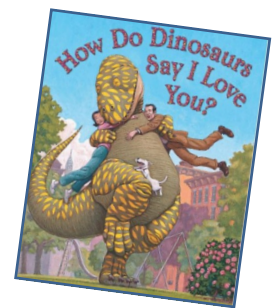
Announcements:
